Lynn's Story

Thank you for asking me to share my story.

Johnny first got Lymphoma in March 2011 while we lived in Australia, we returned home in the August that year for him to start Chemo, Radiotherapy and Stem Cell treatment, which was successful for him as he went into Remission January 2012.



Unfortunately the Lymphoma returned September 2018 after various options Johnny opted to take Chemo and Stem Cell again, his chemo was admitted via a Hickman Line which he was attached to for 23 hours a day for 5 days every 3 weeks, once that was completed he was to undergo Stem Cell hopefully using the Stem Cell of his siblings.

His Chemo finished on Tuesday 5th March, however within 24 hours of getting him home, Johnny went into Multiple Organ Failure Coma due to contracting Sepsis.

He didn't regain consciousness and passed away March 26th 2019, aged just 61. I don't mind telling you that while I am typing this I can't see for the tears. It still seems so surreal. It is still very much unknown how anyone contracts Sepsis, and there are a lot of people who survive, unfortunately for Johnny his body was just too weak to fight.
